Osceola Virtual School offers equitable access to high quality, individualized education, through the Internet and other distance learning technologies from grades K through 12 in Osceola County. This virtual environment provides flexibility of time and location, and promotes development of the skills, attitudes, and self-discipline necessary to achieve success in the 21st century. Osceola Virtual School offers students part-time and full-time enrollment opportunities. Osceola Virtual School includes a variety of assessment techniques that address various learning styles and intelligence types. Online learning through Osceola Virtual Schools enable students to assume responsibility of their own learning. As a part of The School District of Osceola County, Osceola County Virtual School is fully accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS).

All courses offered are taught by highly qualified Florida Certified teachers with regular online and phone office hours. Students and parents are encouraged to speak with their teachers regularly to enhance the educational experiences of their child.

OVS Full Time Student Enrollment Suggested Criteria

Osceola Virtual School is a school of choice and offers a full-time program for students in grades K- 12. Full-time OVS students are registered as public school students, take part in Florida Standards Assessment Test (FSA), End-of-Course Exams (EOC), Stanford Achievement Test (SAT10 – 3rd grade only); Post-Secondary Education Readiness Test (P.E.R.T.), ACCESS for ELL 2.0, Osceola Writes, I-Ready and Reading Plus, and other district and state testing. Students who did not attend **mandatory** testing will be withdrawn from the program.

Students have the opportunity to earn a standard Osceola County diploma. In order to be a successful full-time student with Osceola Virtual School students should:

- Have been successfully promoted to the next grade level at the end of the previous school year. For mid-year entrance, student should have demonstrated success in first semester courses (grades of C or better)
- Attain one of the following minimum scores on previous year standardized tests:
 - FSA passing score in Reading and Math with a level 3 or higher
 - Stanford Achievement Test 10 Reading Score at 50th percentile or above

*Accepted students must meet all of Osceola County criteria as specified in the Osceola County School District Pupil Progression Plan in order to participate in our full-time program. All full-time students and parents must attend a **mandatory orientation** and submit a full time student application.

**Special Note to applicants currently enrolled and receiving services in an
Exceptional Student Education program (ESE):**

Osceola County School Board ESE Special Programs and Procedures states, “The district assures provision of full educational opportunity to all children with disabilities, aged three through twenty-one, using the kind and number of facilities, personnel, and services necessary to meet this goal. A free appropriate public education (FAPE) is available to all students with disabilities upon determination of need.” Osceola County Virtual School is considered a “school of choice.” This means that the special education or related services which were provided to your child at his/her previous school of enrollment **may not** be provided to him/her at Osceola Virtual School. Please utilize this information to make appropriate academic placement choices for your student for this coming school year and beyond.

Conditional Enrollment/Re-enrollment Agreement

Osceola Virtual School requires all students to meet all conditions that foster a successful online education. During the first 14 days of a student’s activation, he/she will be evaluated by teachers and guidance based on those conditions listed below.

Conditions defining a successful online student:

- Consistent parent/guardian supervision of student
- Maintaining pace in all courses
- Daily engagement in course activities
- Establishing regular communication with all teachers via email and/or phone

- Earning and maintaining grades of C or higher
- Earning appropriate credits/standards for end of year grade promotion
- Participating in all district/state standardized testing
- Honoring all rules and procedures established by Osceola County Virtual School and Osceola County Public Schools for student conduct, academic integrity, and netiquette

If during the initial 14 days, it is determined by Osceola Virtual School that a student is **not recommended** for online education, he/she will be withdrawn with no grade penalty and referred back to school assignment (home zoned school) to pursue a different instructional venue.

If a parent chooses to keep their child enrolled after the 14 days grace period, and Osceola County Virtual School has **not recommended** him/her for online education, the parent should understand that this may result in failing grades and possible future withdrawal for which Osceola County Virtual will not be held responsible.

Meeting the listed conditions is a requirement for continued enrollment.

Academic Integrity

OVS expects a full commitment to academic integrity from each OVS student.

Academic integrity means:

- 🖥️ Your work on each assignment will be completely your own

- 📖 Your collaboration with another classmate on any assignment will be pre-approved by your instructor
- 📖 You will not practice plagiarism in any form
- 📖 You will not allow others to copy your work
- 📖 You will not misuse content from the Internet
- 📖 You will not provide assistance to anyone scheduled to take the same course semester/final exams in the future
- 📖 Your parent/guardian will attest to the fact that your work is completely your own

OVS Academic Integrity: Violations and Consequences

Plagiarism: copying or using ideas or words (from another person, an online classmate, or an Internet or print source) and presenting them as your own; submitting another student's work or sharing files with other students, and/or inconsistencies between written assignments and oral assessments.

Security breaches such as: misuse of passwords, accessing another student's account, providing access to one's account to another student, misrepresenting oneself as another student, or illegally accessing any resources that are intended for instructional evaluation purposes.

1st Offense:

- 📄 Teacher schedules phone call or conference with parent and student to advise of violation
- 📄 Teacher advises student and parent that student must resubmit assignment(s) for 50% credit using his or her original ideas and work before proceeding to next assignment at the teacher's discretion.

2nd Offense:

- 📄 Teacher schedules phone call or conference with parent, student and school administrator
- 📄 Teacher advises student and parent that a "0" (F) on the assignment(s) in question will be issued. Student will complete the Academic Integrity Module within the course. If the academic concern continues, all exams will be proctored. If the violation occurred on an assessment, student will receive a "0" (F) with no opportunity for make- up.
- 📄 For inconsistencies between written assignments and oral assessments, teachers will advise student that proctored exam(s) will be required at the OVS office.

3rd Offense:

- 📄 Teacher schedules phone call or conference with parent, student and school administrator

📖 Student is withdrawn from course with an F and may be withdrawn from the program

📖 Student will lose the privilege to enroll in any additional OVS course(s) in the future

Student Contact and Drop Procedure

Only through continuous communication can students be successful in an online course.

Within each course the instructor outlines the weekly minimum work requirements. It is essential that the student and instructor maintain regular contact. To ensure that our students are aware of this commitment, the process below will be followed:

It is the parents responsibility to monitor pace (attendance) of students and grades.

Teachers and Osceola Virtual School staff are available for assistance.

- Teachers will maintain communication with students, parents, Osceola Virtual administration and OVS Professional school counselor via email, text or phone calls that are logged.
- Students not maintaining the 6% minimum course completion (10% enrolled in Honors courses) of each course per week will be notified via email, text or phone call.
- If the student does not submit the expected number of assignment(s) within a period of seven (7) consecutive days, the student and parent(s) may receive an e-mail or phone call notifying them of the student's unacceptable pace for submitting assignments and may be recommended for withdrawal.

- If the student does not respond by submitting all required assignments within fourteen (14) days of the initial contact, the teacher will send a message to the student, parent and counselor notifying them of the unacceptable pace and that the student has been withdrawn from the course.

Every student has a grace period during the first 14 consecutive days of being activated into an OVS course. During that period, students may drop the course without penalty and teachers can also withdraw unproductive/unsuccessful students from their course to allow them to pursue other educational means without penalty.

Once a student is removed from a course, re-enrollment has to be approved by an administrator.

Case by case evaluation is conducted.

Full Time Student Academic Expectations:

Students must take primary responsibility for their own learning because there will not be a face to face teacher. Self-motivation, dedication to learning and regular participation in class connects or blackboard collaborations are essential. It is the student who determines his or her own level of success. Students can expect deadlines for their work and expect to work hard, but at their own pace within the set guidelines. They'll use discussion boards, chat rooms, and other communication tools to work with teachers and other students. These tools, which may have been used for social purposes, will be used for genuine academic communication to support learning goals as students work toward an Osceola District School's standard high school diploma.

Time & Learning Requirements:

The amount of time students spend on courses will vary from student to student, and even course to course. However, students will have the time they need to complete the coursework (within reason). On average, students should expect to spend *approximately 45 minutes to one hour per day per course* if they wish to complete the course in the

typical time periods for 0.5 or 1.0 credit courses. Students must maintain a **minimum** completion pace of 6% of each course segment each week. Students on the accelerated pace must maintain a minimum pace of 10% of the course segment each week. Full-time students failing to maintain pace face consideration for withdraw. Extenuating circumstances may permit the student more time for completion if requested to OVS Administration in a timely manner.

School Calendar:

Osceola County Virtual School operates on the same calendar as all other Osceola County Public Schools. All full-time students are expected to be enrolled in 6 courses and must meet the requirements of the Osceola County Student Progression Plan. Those failing to earn the necessary credits for grade promotion will not be allowed to continue virtual enrollment.

Communication & Login (including attendance and absences):

Regular participation in classes is critical to student success. It will help to keep students motivated and keep them in touch with their teachers and peers. Attendance in online coursework and course submissions and assessments are monitored. Reports from each class can be used to show the amount of time a student works in the course. Students should log in to each of their courses daily to achieve successful completion. Teachers and virtual school staff will contact students by email and phone if they do not appear to be engaging frequently or making satisfactory progress in their courses. If such efforts do not succeed in reengaging the student, the parent will be notified. To have

satisfactory “attendance”, work must be submitted frequently, students must be on pace, unless arrangements are made in advance with the OVS teachers and staff.

Students who know they will not be participating in a course due to vacation, travel or other commitment must be ahead of pace and notify their teachers and school office *at least two weeks* in advance of the planned absence to discuss the completion of assignments and pacing beforehand. In the case of a prolonged emergency absence, the student and/or parent should notify school administration as soon as possible.

The following items are **non-negotiable**, Students are required to complete assigned communication to include:

Collaboration Assignments & Discussion Based Assessment (DBA) – FLVS

Class Connects – Get Fueled (K12)

Academic Counseling:

Once per school year, full time students will receive a review of their academic progress toward completing elementary, middle school and/or obtaining a standard high school diploma; and be advised of course selection, career and post-secondary planning.

Seniors are required to meet with the OVS Professional School Counselor at least 3 times during their senior year. The Osceola Virtual Professional School Counselor is available to support, encourage and monitor the success of students. Although any questions about the specifics of a course should be directed to the particular teacher, any general questions about the school or the student’s education should be directed to the Professional School Counselor. An evaluation of each student will be conducted at the

end of each school year to determine their continued enrollment for the next school year. *To maintain continuous enrollment at Osceola Virtual School, a student must earn passing grades in each course, maintain consistent pacing in every class, communicate successfully with teachers, and participate in all required standardized testing.* Those students who fail to meet the minimum continuation standards will be referred to the administration.

Standardized Tests:

Osceola Virtual School expects full-time students to take all standardized tests instituted by the School District of Osceola County and the State of Florida. The tests **are not** administered virtually; students must provide their own transportation to Osceola Virtual School Office at the assigned test time. If a student does not complete the mandatory standardized tests, **the student will not be allowed to continue enrollment with OVS, no exceptions.**

Transfer Grades:

Any grades earned at a non-public school are subject to Osceola County Public School's accreditation policy and course codes and credits are determined by Florida's course Code Directory. There are no guarantees of identical course transfers. All Osceola Virtual grades are transferrable to any Florida public school upon completion. Transfers that occur prior to the completion of a course will receive no credit and no grade.

Participant Roles:

Student: Students are primarily responsible for their learning. They must take the initiative to log in to the school, participate in discussions, and complete their work at the highest possible level of quality. Students must seek help when they need it, establish their own daily schedules, and take responsibility for meeting deadlines.

Parent/Guardian: Parents' support is critical for successful participation and completion. They are responsible for providing adequate supervision for their students and supporting the student's learning. This includes providing a suitable working environment, encouragement and appropriate assistance with course content when possible. With the **parent account**, parents also have access to many aspects of the school, including grades and participation reports. They will probably find themselves more involved in their child's education than they have been before – and more in touch with their student's progress. It is **expected** that **parents monitor** their child's academic activities daily through direct supervision as well as the online guardian account.

Senior Student Responsibilities:

- Complete all graduation requirements
- Attend 3 mandatory meetings with Professional School Counselor
- Attend senior interview with Professional School Counselor
- Pay all obligations
- Order Cap & Gown
- Attend Graduation Ceremony

- **Graduation Ceremony:** Qualifying seniors are strongly encouraged to participate in the High School Commencement Ceremony at the end of the year. Completion of 24 or 18 regular credits, appropriate courses, 2.0 GPA, and purchase of a cap & gown are required. Below is a link with the explanation of diploma options.

OVS advises all students to select, type, print, post, and follow a daily schedule of course activity suitable to make it a routine part of their daily lives.

While times and days to work are flexible, students are required to submit a MINIMUM number of assignments each week per course.

A DAY IN THE LIFE OF AN OVS STUDENT

SAMPLE SCHEDULE A (ALL COURSES EVERY DAY):

1) This schedule is based on a six-course day. Students can adjust the hours based on their schedule. This schedule allows for breaks in between courses as well as a liberal lunch.

2) Students are encouraged to continue working in the assigned course even if they have finished the pace for the week in that subject, ie: If Johnny has 20 minutes left assigned to English but he has finished the pace work for the week he is encouraged to work ahead into the next pace week for the remaining time in the English slot. Students are encouraged to move to the next course when the time is up for the day. They are encouraged to finish the work the next day during the appropriate time slot.

Osceola Virtual Instruction Scheduling Guide For Full-Time Students

The basic intent of this scheduling process is to allow students to broaden their access to classes. Students choose six credits to be studied over the school year. The school year will be divided into two semesters. During each semester a student will typically be assigned no less than six courses. All OVS full-time students are required to participate in all district-wide testing.

- 6 credits per year
- 1 credit (36 weeks of study) or .5 credit (18 weeks of study) per class
- 6 credits at a time

Osceola County Virtual School may enroll full time students only during open enrollment periods.

High School Grade Classification

No student may be assigned to a grade level based solely on age or other factors that constitute social promotion. (F.S. 1008.25(6)(a)) **Starting in 2009-10, grade designation for high school students will be determined as follows:**

a) Following completion of one year designated as a 9th grader, as well as earning 5.0 credits, the student will be designated a 10th grader.

b) Following completion of one year designated as a 10th grader, as well as earning 11.0 credits, the student will be designated as an 11th grader

c) Following completion of one year as an 11th grader, as well as earning 18.0 credits, the student will be designated as a 12th grader

High School Forgiveness Rule

Students may elect to repeat a course for credit in order to improve their record and/or raise the cumulative grade point average. A student may repeat a course for which he/she has received a grade of "D", "F" or "I" and must earn a "C" or higher for that same course. The highest grade earned will be computed in determining the grade point average. The student's record will reflect all courses attempted and grades earned. **The forgiveness rule shall be applied only once per course.**

HIGH SCHOOL COLLEGE CREDIT PROGRAMS

DUAL ENROLLMENT PROGRAM

High school students who meet program requirements may concurrently enroll in courses that are creditable toward a post-secondary certificate, associate's degree, or bachelor's degree at technical centers, college and state universities that have entered into an articulation agreement with Osceola County.

Note: Most three credit hour dual enrollment courses equate to one-half (.5) high school credit. Some three and four credit hour dual enrollment courses equate to one (1.0) high school credit.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT PROGRAM

The Advanced Placement Program consists of over 30 college level courses and exams that are offered at high schools. Courses are available in several subject areas from art to statistics. Participation in AP courses gives students an excellent preparation for college and university studies. Successful completion of the course and receipt of a qualifying score on the national AP exam will result in college credit or advanced placement in college courses at many colleges and universities. Students who successfully complete an AP course but do NOT take the AP exam will receive high school credit only for the course.

HIGH SCHOOL BRIGHT FUTURES SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMS

The Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program establishes lottery-funded scholarships to reward any Florida high school graduate who merits recognition for high academic achievement. The Scholarship Program is the umbrella program for all State-funded scholarships based on academic achievement in high school. The three scholarships are the Florida Academic Scholars Award, the Florida Gold Seal Vocational Scholars Award, and the Florida Medallion Scholars Award. COLLEGE ADMISSION TESTS

Most college and universities require a college admissions test score as a part of the application process. The ACT and the SAT tests are administered several times each school year. Students may elect to take one or both of the tests. Registration may be done by completing a paper registration form or by applying online at **www.act.org** or

www.collegeboard.com. This is the ideal time to demonstrate one's knowledge in that particular subject area. Check the college website or college catalog for further information. Log on to: www.collegeboard.com or www.actstudent.org.

Graduation Options

Florida Law gives all high school students the right to choose one of two diploma options: Students must pass the FSA Reading and Algebra 1 EOC test in order to graduate regardless of diploma chosen.

- 4-year (24 credit) standard high school diploma
- 3-year (18 credit) Academically Challenging Curriculum to Enhance Learning Options (ACCEL)

If a student does not make a choice, the four-year option will be selected for that student. Osceola Virtual School assumes, unless indicated otherwise, that all entering 9th graders are pursuing a 24 credit diploma.

WHAT IS MEASURED BY THE FSA?

The FSA measures student knowledge and understanding of reading, writing, science, and mathematics content as described in the *Florida Common Core Standards*. There is a direct connection between the *Florida Common Core Standards* and the questions on the FSA.

WHAT ARE THE FLORIDA CORE STANDARDS?

The Standards are skills and competencies that Florida students should be able to learn from an early age, as defined by practicing classroom teachers, educational specialists, business people, and concerned citizens from Florida.

Test Taking Tips for Parents to Remember

- 1) Make sure your child **attends school regularly**. Remember that tests reflect the overall achievement of your child. The more often the child is in a learning situation, the more likely he/she will do well on tests.
- 2) Give your child **encouragement**. Praise him/her for the things done well throughout the year. A child who is afraid of failing is more likely to make a mistake.
- 3) See that your child has a **well-rounded diet**. A healthy body leads to a healthy, active mind.
- 4) See that your child **completes homework assignments**. Homework supports classroom instruction and can help your child increase his/her comprehension of the classroom work.
- 5) **Talk with your child's virtual teacher(s)** as often as possible to discuss your child's progress. Parents and teachers should work together to benefit the child.
- 6) Ask the teacher(s) to suggest **activities for you to do at home** with your child. Such activities can help your child improve his/her understanding of school work.
- 7) Make sure your child is **well rested** on school days. Children who are tired are less likely to pay attention in class or to handle the demands of class work and tests.
- 8) Try not to be overly anxious about test scores. Too much emphasis on test scores can be upsetting to children.
- 9) Find out which tests your child will take and for what purposes. The school principal and Testing Coordinator should provide you with a schedule of testing for the year and explain the use of the tests.
- 10) Make sure your child arrives **on time** at the scheduled test site.

- 11) Make sure that your child **dresses comfortably**. Students should wear clothes that are comfortable and appropriate for the weather.
- 12) If your child wears a hearing aid or glasses, be sure he/she remembers to use them during all testing sessions.
- 13) Make sure your child does not bring any electronic devices, such as cellular phones to the test.
- 14) Make sure your child receives any necessary test taking accommodations.
- 15) Remember, make sure that your child is well rested and has a healthy breakfast on the day of the test

Frequently Asked Questions

Osceola Virtual School

HOW DO I ENROLL FULL-TIME IN OSCEOLA VIRTUAL SCHOOL?

Enrollment in our full-time program takes place before the first and second semesters of the school year. Students/parents are required to attend a **mandatory orientation** and submit a complete application. Applications must be completed in full along with required documentation.

IS OSCEOLA VIRTUAL SCHOOL ACCREDITED?

Osceola Virtual School is fully accredited by the (SACS) Southern Association of Colleges and Schools and the (CITA) Commission on International and Trans-Regional Accreditation. Osceola Virtual School is also registered with the Florida State Department of Education and a part of the Osceola County Public School system. Our accredited online high school diploma and all credits earned at OVS are accepted by 6-12 schools, colleges, universities, and employers.

CAN I ATTEND OVS ON A FULL OR PART-TIME BASIS?

It is our goal to provide students with a level of service they require. We can offer a full curriculum for grades K-12; or just one or two courses to satisfy your current public school graduation requirements; or supplement your home school curriculum.

WHAT IS THE COST?

Free to Osceola County Residents.

WHO TEACHES THE ONLINE COURSES AT OVS?

All online high school courses and programs are taught by highly qualified Osceola County Public School instructors for students in FLVS courses, and K-12 teachers are highly qualified for Get Fueled Education. All instructional staff must meet Florida Department of Education certification requirements. You can be sure that quality in education is our #1 goal!

WHAT IF THE STUDENT HAS QUESTIONS OR PROBLEMS WHILE TAKING A COURSE?

Students are assigned an instructor for each course. Instructors are available daily via web conference, email, or telephone. Support services are available to all Osceola Virtual School students through our office.

WHAT IS THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN OVS AND TRADITIONAL BRICK-AND-MORTAR HIGH SCHOOLS?

There is no difference in the curriculum between OVS and traditional high schools. There is a significant difference in the flexibility offered to all OVS students in the way they can earn their courses/ credits online.

IS OVS LESS CHALLENGING THAN OTHER TRADITIONAL ACCREDITED HIGH SCHOOLS?

No. As an accredited school, OVS offers a flexible alternative for students. It is not an easier option than traditional accredited high schools. All courses are written at or above grade level and require an **average of one to two hours of focused study on a daily basis to complete one course within the traditional semester time frame.** Our courses engage students in real-life projects, requiring the use of critical thinking, problem-solving skills, and the ability to apply the knowledge they have acquired.

AS A PARENT, WILL I BE KEPT INFORMED OF MY STUDENTS' PROGRESS?

Absolutely, as a parent, you will likely receive more updates and information about your child's education, this is a critical part of virtual classes. Our teachers provide frequent online reports to parents. You can always see how your child is performing by logging in to the parent/guardian account

WHO ARE OVS STUDENTS?

Any student seeking a quality education through a flexible format is a potential OVS student. OVS students are students who benefit from individualized instruction, athletes, performers, highly motivated students who prefer to accelerate, part-time students, students who travel, students with medical issues or home school students.

WHAT IF I WANT TO WITHDRAW FROM OVS?
